At a public hearing of the City Council, in the City of Woonsocket, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island in Harris Hall on Monday, November 21, 2016 at 6:30 P.M.

All members are present.

The following ordinance is read by title:

16 O 56 An ordinance in amendment of Code of Ordinances, Appendix C entitled "Zoning" regarding fencing permits.

There was no one present wishing to address the council.

Upon motion of Councilman Gendron seconded by Councilman Beauchamp it is voted that the public hearing be and it is hereby adjourned at 6:43 P.M.

The regular meeting follows at 7:00 P.M.

All members are present.

The prayer is read by the Clerk. The Pledge of Allegiance is given by the assembly.

The following persons addressed the council under citizens good and welfare: William Doe, Richard Fagnant, Debra Chom, Charles Lemoine and Bob Phillips.

Upon motion of Councilman Jalette seconded by Councilman Gendron it is voted that the minutes of the regular meeting held November 7th be approved as submitted, a voice vote on same being unanimous.

Upon motion of Councilman Jalette seconded by Councilman Gendron it is voted that the consent agenda be approved as submitted, a voice vote on same being unanimous.


This letter constitutes presentment to the Council of a claim or demand against the City of Woonsocket ("City") by this firm's client, Zenon Bauzyk, pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-15-5.

Mr. Bauzyk's claims arise out of his seizure effectuated with unnecessary and excessive force, which was not objectively reasonable under the circumstances, carried out by officers in the City Police Department, acting within the scope of their employment with and as agents for the City. In particular, Mr. Bauzyk alleges that on September 21, 2016, while he was in the process of being seized, although he offered no resistance whatsoever, officers in the City Police Department used unnecessary and excessive force in effectuating his arrest, causing severe injuries to Mr. Bauzyk, thereby giving rise to his claims against the City under 42 U.S.C. §1983 as well as the Rhode Island Constitution, and common law claims for negligence.

As a direct and proximate result of the aforesaid unlawful acts of agents of the City of Woonsocket and the failure of the City to properly train, discipline and supervise members of its police department, Mr. Bauzyk suffered severe personal injuries, has and will continue to endure great pain and suffering, emotional distress, deprivation of his civil rights, and has been forced to incur expenses for legal services and medical care and treatment.

Dear Councilors:

This claim for property damage arises out of an alleged incident that occurred on November 12, 2016 at around 6:30 p.m. Mr. Comeau states he was driving on Greene Street that evening and felt his left tires run over something. He looked in his rearview mirror and thought he saw object that might have been a piece of wood in the road, but did not stop to investigate. His daughter noticed damage to his vehicle the next day. He now believes he must have struck a manhole cover.

Mr. Comeau submitted three repair estimates; one from Roy's Auto Body totaling \$1,396.66, one from Bernier's Auto Body totaling \$1,258.77 and another from Michaud Auto Body totaling \$1,238.43. He was unable to provide a police report as he did not call the police, not realizing any damage occurred to his vehicle.

The Department of Public Works was contacted and there was no evidence of any manhole or other covers out of place on that date and as such, the City is within its rights to deny the claim. I recommend that this claim be denied.



**In Amendment of the Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket,
R. I. Appendix C, Entitled "Zoning" Fencing Permits**

WHEREAS, the Department of Planning and Development staff has recommended a change to the present Zoning Ordinance of the City of Woonsocket; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of such a change will provide for more clarification and public understanding of the zoning requirements.

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the City of Woonsocket, Rhode Island, has recommended approval of such amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Woonsocket as being consistent with the Comprehensive Plan of the City of Woonsocket, Rhode Island, As amended.

**IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. The Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket, Rhode Island, Appendix C, entitled "Zoning" is hereby amended as follows:

Section 6.2 Screening and Fencing is amended by adding thereto the following provision:

Section 6.2-6 Permit required: Any screening or fencing constructed under the provisions of this section shall require application for and the issuance of a permit from the office of the building & zoning officials in a form to be determined by that office. The cost of such permit in all cases shall be fifty dollars and no cents (\$50.00).

SECTION 2. The City Council scheduled and held a public hearing to consider this ordinance within sixty-five (65) days of receipt, and has given notice of said hearing by publication in the *Woonsocket CALL* at least once each week for three (3) consecutive weeks prior to the date of said hearing. Such newspaper notice was published as a display advertisement, using a type size at least as large as the normal type size used by the newspaper in its news articles, and that such notice:

- (1) Specified the place of said public hearing and the date and time of its commencement;
- (2) Indicated that amendment(s) of the comprehensive plan and of the zoning ordinance, or part thereof, were under consideration;
- (3) Contained a statement of the proposed amendments to the ordinance and map once in its entirety, with the second and third publication referencing the date of the first publication;
- (4) Included one or more maps showing existing and proposed zoning district boundaries, existing streets and roads including their names, and the city and town boundaries where appropriate.
- (5) Advised those interested where and when a copy of the matter under consideration could be obtained or examined and copies; and
- (6) Stated that the proposal shown thereon may be altered or amended prior to the close of the public hearing without further advertising, as a result of further study or because of the views expressed at the public hearing. And that any such alterations or amendments must be presented for comment in the course of said hearing.

SECTION 3. At least two (2) weeks prior to the hearing, a copy of the newspaper notice described in Section 2 above was be sent by the City Clerk to the Associate Director of the Division of Planning of the Rhode Island Department of Administration.

SECTION 4. At least two (2) weeks prior to the hearing, a copy of the newspaper notice described in Section 2 was sent by the City Clerk by first class mail to the city or town council of any city or town to which one (1) of the following applies:

- (1) Any portion of the city or town is located within two hundred (200) feet of the perimeter of the area proposed for change; and/or
- (2) There is a public or quasi-public water source, or private water source that is used or is suitable for use as a public water source, within two thousand (2,000) feet of any real propety that is the subject of a proposed zoning change, regardless of municipal boundaries.

SECTION 5. At least two (2) weeks prior to the hearing, a copy of the newspaper notice described in Section 3 above was sent by the City Clerk by first class mail to the governing body of any state or municipal water department or agency, special water district, or private water company that has riparian rights to a surface water source and/or surface watershed that is used or is suitable for use as a public water source and that is within two thousand (2,000) feet of any real property which is the subject of a proposed zoning change, provided however, that the governing body of any state or municipal water department or agency has filed with the Building Inspector a map survey, which shall be kept as a public record, showing areas of surface water resources and/or watersheds and parcels of land within two thousand (2,000) feet thereof.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall be enacted in accordance with the provisions of Sections 45-24-27 and 45-24-72 of the Rhode Island General Laws, and amended, and shall take effect on the immediately following its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith me hereby repealed.

In Amendment of the Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket, R.I. Chapter 15, Entitled "Parks and Recreation"

WHEREAS, the City of Woonsocket has adopted a policy to grant permission of public parks for non-athletic events with general admission by the public by authority of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest for the City to rent out public facilities for additional revenue and to bring in visitors to Woonsocket which generates business for local establishments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to streamline the process to make it easier for public parks to be rented out for private functions by the general public.

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 15-7 entitled "Use of public park for non-athletic event admitting general public" of Chapter 15 entitled "Parks and Recreation" of the Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket is hereby amended as follows:

~~(a) No permit shall be issued for the use of any public park for any non-athletic event to which the general public is admitted without first obtaining permission of the city council upon such terms as are appropriate and in the best interest of the city.~~

(a) After written application, a permit shall be issued for the use of any public park for any non-athletic event to which the general public is admitted by obtaining permission by the Parks and Recreation Director for date reservation and fee collection, with written or electronic approval by the Public Works Director or his designee and the Public Safety Director or his designees. Any approval for the use of public parks may include user fees and other terms that are appropriate and in the best interest of the City.

(b) Any application or user fee(s) shall be deposited in the recreation restricted account as established by the Director of Finance.

(c) Monthly financial reports shall be submitted by the Parks and Recreation Director to the Public Works Director showing all revenue collected during the previous month.

(d) Notice of all approved permits shall be forwarded electronically to the City Clerk's office to be distributed to City Council members upon request.

(e) Any event open to the general public shall be posted on the City website by the Parks and Recreation Director unless otherwise requested by the event's coordinator/sponsor.


(f) Any denial of use or conditions for use of a City Park by the Director of Public Works or Public Safety Director may be appealed to the City Council.

Provided, however, that all-day parking is allowed in the rear lot, to be so designated by appropriate signage.

SECTION 2. That Section 17-129.1 entitled, "Monument Square Upper Parking Lot" of Chapter 17 entitled, "Traffic" of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:




