DESIGN-BUILD-OPERATE CONTRACT FOR
NEW WATER TREATMENT PLANT FACILITIES
REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS – BID #5695

Sealed proposals for the Design-Build-Operate of New Water Treatment Facilities (Project) will be received by the City of Woonsocket, Rhode Island (City) at City Hall at the Office of the Finance Department, Office of Purchasing, 169 Main Street, Woonsocket, Rhode Island 02895 until 2:00 PM, Wednesday, January 13, 2016.

By issuance of this Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Project, the City seeks Proposals for a Company to provide:

Design/Build/Operations and Maintenance Work, which generally consists of the permitting, design, construction, start-up and acceptance testing of a new Raw Water Pump Station (RWPS), a new raw water transmission main, a new redundant raw water transmission main, and a New Water Treatment Plant (New WTP) with associated utility connections and pavement and drainage improvements on Jillson Avenue. The New WTP will be sized for an initial capacity of 7.0 mgd expandable to 10.5 mgd. Following start-up, acceptance testing and final regulatory approvals, the Design/Build Work shall include the decommissioning and partial demolition of the existing Charles G. Hammann Memorial Water Treatment Plant (WTP) at 1500 Manville Road. Operation and Maintenance services, which generally consist of operations, maintenance, repair, replacement, and asset management services for the WTP (short term) and the New WTP, will be for a period of one to two years for the existing WTP and for a set term of twenty years plus potential extensions for the New WTP.
