At a regular meeting of the City Council, in the City of Woonsocket, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island in Harris Hall on Monday, February 19, 2018 at 7 P.M.

All members are present.

The prayer is read by the Clerk. The Pledge of Allegiance is given by the assembly.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Murray seconded by Councilman Beauchamp it is voted that the minutes of the regular meeting held February 5th and special meeting held February 8th be approved as submitted, a voice vote on same being unanimous.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Murray seconded by Councilman Cournoyer it is voted that the consent agenda be approved as submitted, a voice vote on same being unanimous.

Councilman Brien addressed Public Safety Director regarding intersection of Burnside Avenue and Elm Street. He also addressed odor report.

Councilman Cournoyer spoke to Public Works Director about purchase of sander and stated that a good job was done on recent snowstorm.

Councilman Fagnant spoke about notification to abutters when a number of break ins occur in a certain neighborhood. He spoke about elected vs. appointed school committee and former deficit. He spoke about vehicles registered out of state. He addressed Robinson Street ordinance. He addressed Mayor regarding incinerator appraisal

Councilwoman Murray mentioned a fundraiser for Eagle Scout Xavier Denis at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs & Knights of Columbus pasta dinner fundraiser to benefit Copswalk at All Saints Church both on February 24th. She addressed Public Works Director regarding locked playground at splash park. She spoke about school committee issue (hybrid system) referendum.

- 18 O 4 An ordinance in amendment of Code of Ordinances Appendix C entitled "Zoning" regarding various technical changes is read by title, and

Upon motion of Councilman Fagnant seconded by Councilmen Cournoyer and Gendron it is voted that the ordinance be tabled, advertised for hearing and scheduled for a work session on February 26, 2018 at 6:30 PM, a voice vote on same being unanimous.

- 18 O 5 An ordinance authorizing Public Works Director to sell salt brine to private entities is read by title, and

A motion is made by Councilman Brien seconded by Councilwomen Murray and Sierra that the ordinance be passed for the first time, however, before this is voted on

Upon motion of Councilman Cournoyer seconded by Councilman Beauchamp it is voted that the ordinance be amended as follows: Delete sections 1 and 2 in their entirety and replace with the following text: Section 1. At the discretion of the Director of Public Works, the City may sell salt brine to private entities. Such sales shall be pursuant to a signed agreement between the City and the purchaser wherein the purchaser agrees, in part to the following: 1) That the purchase price of the salt brine shall be no less than \$.45 per gallon (plus sale tax if applicable) adjusted annually by the Director of Public Works with no cap. 2) That the purchase shall be invoiced monthly and shall pay within 15 days of the invoice date. 3) That the sale of the salt brine to the purchaser shall be subject to availability as determined by the Director of Public Works. For the avoidance of doubt, if at any time, the Director of Public Works determines that the City has insufficient salt brine available for its own needs, the City shall not be obligated to sell salt brine. 4) To the extent that there is more than one purchaser, and notwithstanding the proviso in (3) salt brine shall be sold on a first come, first serve basis. 5) The purchaser shall sign a "Waiver of Liability" releasing the City of any warranty, representation, guarantee or liability whatsoever arising from the salt brine product, including any liability or damage that may arise from or during the purchase and delivery of the salt brine. Section 2. The revenue received from the sale of salt brine shall be deposited into and accounted for within a separate general fund revenue account to be created and tracked by the Finance Department. The amendment is voted on and passed for the first time, as amended, a roll call vote on same being unanimous.

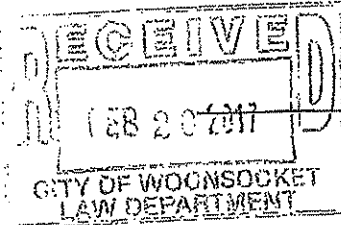

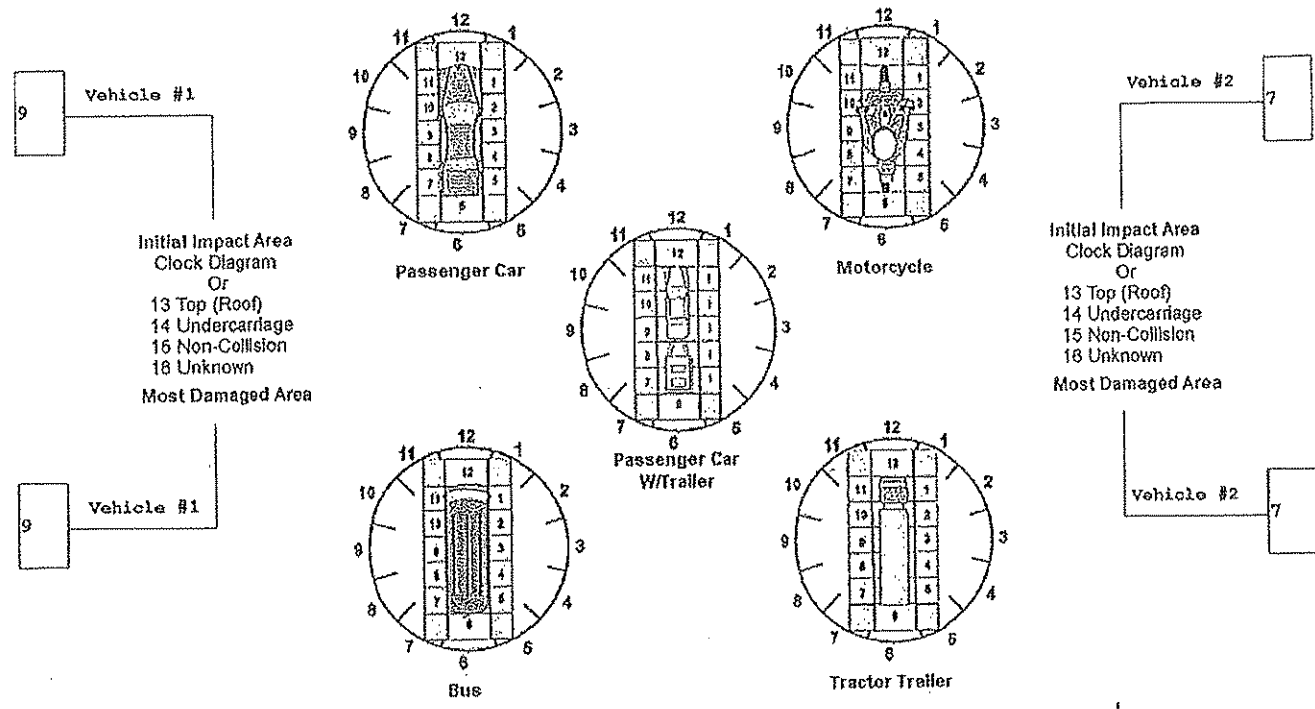

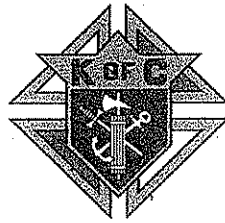

Narrative:

On 30 January 2018, at approximately 1130 hours, I responded to the intersection of Louise and Norman St. to a report of a M/V Accident involving a City Plow Truck. Upon arrival I met with the city driver identified as Martin Petijohn (RI/OLN 3713139) operating city truck RI/REG 1602. Martin stated he was pushing snow towards the dead end of Louise when he backed up in to V1 (RI/PC 573-692). Martin stated he did not notice that V1 had pulled out of 17 Louise St. and parked on the road. The rear driver's side corner of the truck's bed struck the rear driver's side door of V1 creating moderate damage to the door.

There was no one inside V1 when I arrived on scene. Martin advised me the male driver had gone inside his home. I knocked on the door and located the registered owner of V1 identified as Katrina Scott. Scott stated her husband, Thoranong Khongsouvankham, had been the operator of the vehicle when the accident occurred. Katrina stated her husband had taken a different vehicle to drop her daughter to school and was on his way back. Thoranong stated he moved the vehicle on to the street because his wife has a hard time driving in the snow, but had no excuse on why I had just observed him pulling in in a different vehicle fully knowing his license to operate a vehicle was suspended.

Thoranong was cited for operating a vehicle with a suspended license (1st) and given a 6th District appearance date of February 12th at 0900 hours, and a RITT appearance date of February 15th at 0900 hours for operating a vehicle with a suspended registration. Due to computer problems I was unable to issue citations on scene. I advised the operator of V1 that he would receive all citation at his home (17 Louise St Woonsocket).

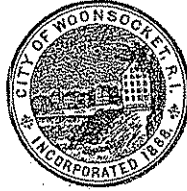

**AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO SELL
SALT BRINE TO PRIVATE ENTITIES**

- WHEREAS,** the City of Woonsocket has been approached by private entities inquiring about the purchasing of brine during inclement weather; and
- WHEREAS,** the entities shall sign a 'Wavier of Liability' releasing the City of any warranty, representation, guarantee or any liability whatsoever arising from the brine product ; and
- WHEREAS,** those entities will agree to pay the City of Woonsocket \$.45 (plus sales tax if applicable), adjusted annually, per gallon for the purchase of salt brine.

**IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:**

- SECTION 1.** the Director of Public Works will sell salt brine to private entities as needed, as requested. Those entities will be invoiced monthly for the sale of salt brine at the rate of \$.45/gallon (plus sales tax if applicable), adjusted annually per the Director, on an "on-needed" basis with no cap. The revenue received will be deposited in a new revenue account, tracked by the Finance Department.
- SECTION 2.** the entities shall sign a 'Wavier of Liability' releasing the City of any warranty, representation, guarantee or any liability whatsoever arising from the brine product.
- SECTION 3.** This Ordinance shall take effect on the eleventh consecutive day following its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Amendment to Ordinance 18-O-05

Section 1: At the discretion of the Director of Public Works, the City may sell salt brine to private entities. Such sales shall be pursuant to a signed agreement between the City and the purchaser wherein the purchaser agrees, in part, to the following:

- i) that the purchase price of the salt brine shall be no less than \$0.45 per gallon (plus sales tax if applicable), adjusted annually by the Director of Public Works with no cap.
- ii) that the purchaser shall be invoiced monthly and shall pay within 15 days of the invoice date.
- iii) that the sale of the salt brine to the purchaser shall be subject to availability as determined by the Director of Public Works. For the avoidance of doubt, if at any time, the Director of Public Works determines that the City has insufficient salt brine available for its own needs, the City shall not be obligated to sell salt brine.
- iv) to the extent that there is more than one purchaser, and notwithstanding the proviso in (iii), salt brine shall be sold on a first come, first serve basis.
- v) the purchaser shall sign a "Waiver of Liability" releasing the City of any warranty, representation, guarantee or liability whatsoever arising from the salt brine product, including any liability or damage that may arise from or during the purchase and delivery of the salt brine.

Section 2: The revenue received from the sale of salt brine shall be deposited into and accounted for within a separate general fund revenue account to be created and tracked by the Finance Department

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect on the eleventh consecutive day following its passage....

- WHEREAS,** Special events held in the City of Woonsocket are a great way to promote the City, bring in new visitors, and are a boost to our local businesses; and
- WHEREAS,** The Woonsocket City Council wishes to amend this policy to allow for alcohol to be served at special events on city property by licensed vendors with approval of a majority of the City Council.

**IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:**

- SECTION 1.** That Section 3-1 entitled, "Possession of open container on public ways prohibited" of the Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket is hereby amended to include the following:

Section 3-1 Possession of open container on public ways prohibited.

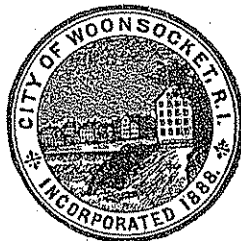
No person, whether in or outside a motor vehicle, shall possess any open alcoholic beverage container on any public street, sidewalk, parking lot or park operated by the city or state within the city.

Exception: Alcoholic beverages may be allowed for special events after application and approval by the Woonsocket Board of License Commissioners. Written approval is also required by the Department of Public Works and the Department of Public Safety, where certain permits or fees may be required. Any application approved pursuant to this Ordinance shall be in conformance with applicable DBR regulations and State law.

- SECTION 2.** This Ordinance shall take effect on the eleventh consecutive day following its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

AUTHORIZATION TO SELL THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 102-114 ROBINSON STREET, WOONSOCKET, RHODE ISLAND

WHEREAS, the City of Woonsocket purchased the property located at 102-114 Robinson Street, Woonsocket, Rhode Island (the "Property") on December 6, 2017 for Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) (See Exhibit A attached hereto); and

WHEREAS, the structure on the Property is in a rundown dilapidated state and must be demolished which will advance the long-term goals of the City by decreasing density of the housing stock and improving the quality of life of all our City residents; and

WHEREAS, the City has an interested Buyer who has agreed to pay Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for the Property with the understanding that the Buyer will demolish the structure on the Property and bear any and all costs associated with said demolition.

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council agrees to sell the Property located at 102-114 Robinson Street, Woonsocket, Rhode Island to Aidance Scientific, LLC (the "Buyer") for the amount of Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

SECTION 2. The City Council authorizes the Mayor and/or her designee to sell the Property located at 102-114 Robinson Street, Woonsocket, Rhode Island for the amount of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and to execute any and all documents to perform same including a deed with the following restrictions: In consideration of said conveyance from the City of Woonsocket, said Buyer shall demolish the building at is sole expense within ninety (90) days after acquiring title and leave the premises level and free and clear of all debris; that the Buyer shall have the right to construct a commercial building only with adequate parking in accordance with all zoning regulations for the City of Woonsocket; that there will be no time constraint upon the Buyer to construct such building. A - if they are still interested in purchasing the subject property, they should submit a written offer to purchase with their best and final offer to the City Clerk's Office, with a copy to the Mayor, by no later than 2:00 pm on Friday, March 23, 2018.

B - that such offer should include the name and address of the proposed buyer, proposed purchase price, proposed uses for the property, any contingencies or conditions associated with their offer, along with any other information they deem appropriate.

C - that the City Council shall endeavor to make a decision on the acceptance of an offer by no later than April 30, 2018, provided that the City Council may, in its sole discretion, reject any and all offers and may elect to not sell the property.

SECTION 2. That the City Clerk, by the close of business on Friday, March 23, 2018, shall forward to the City Council copies of all offers received for the purchase of the property at 706 Social Street.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage by the City Council.

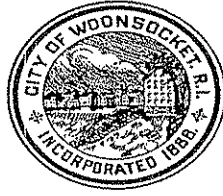

**INSTRUCTING THE MAYOR, VIA HER ADMINISTRATION, TO ISSUE
REFUND CHECKS TO TAXPAYERS THAT ARE OWED REFUNDS IN
CONNECTION WITH THE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX PHASE OUT**

WHEREAS, in the summer of 2017, the State of Rhode Island enacted measures to phase out the motor vehicle tax *after* the City had levied its motor vehicle tax for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the State's motor vehicle tax phase out actions, approximately \$1,337,000 of taxes that were levied by the City in connection with the motor vehicle tax have been abated from the City's original levy, with the State reimbursing the City for the approximate \$1,337,000 abatement; and

WHEREAS, to date, the City has received approximately 75% of the reimbursement from the State; and

WHEREAS, to date, most taxpayers are still owed a refund or a credit in connection with the motor vehicle tax phase out; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter IV, Section 3(i) of the City's Home Rule Charter, the mayor shall *"perform such other duties as may be required of her by ordinance or resolution of the council."*

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET, RHODE ISLAND, AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. That the Mayor, by and through her administration, shall issue refund checks to all taxpayers that are owed a motor vehicle tax refund in connection with the motor vehicle tax phase out by no later than April 13, 2018. For the avoidance of doubt, the refund checks shall be mailed no later than Friday, April 13, 2018.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage by the City Council.
