At a regular meeting of the City Council, in the City of Woonsocket, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island in Harris Hall on Monday, February 20, 2017 at 7 P.M.

Six members are present. Councilman Beauchamp is absent.

The prayer is read by the Clerk. The Pledge of Allegiance is given by the assembly.

The following persons addressed the council under citizens good and welfare: Edward Tupper, Charles Lemoine, Albert G. Brien and Debra Chom.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Murray seconded by Councilman Fagnant it is voted that the minutes of the regular meeting held February 6th, liquor hearing held February 7th and special meeting held February 15th be approved as submitted, a voice vote on same being unanimous.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Murray seconded by Councilman Cournoyer it is voted that the consent agenda be approved as submitted, a voice vote on same being unanimous.

A motion is made by Councilwoman Murray seconded by Councilman Brien that the ordinance be passed for the first time, however before this is voted on

Upon motion of Councilman Fagnant seconded by Councilwoman Murray it is voted that the ordinance be amended as follows: in Section 1 paragraph with * insert "application" after additional; insert "approximately" before three dollars; insert "or the vendor directly. Adjustments may be made to this fee as per the contract terms." after Island, a roll call vote on same unanimous. The ordinance, as amended, is then voted on and passed for the first time, a roll call vote on same being unanimous.

Upon motion of Councilman Cournoyer seconded by Councilors Brien and Sierra it is voted that the ordinance be passed, a roll call vote on same being 5-1 with Councilwoman Murray voting no.


Dear Councilors:

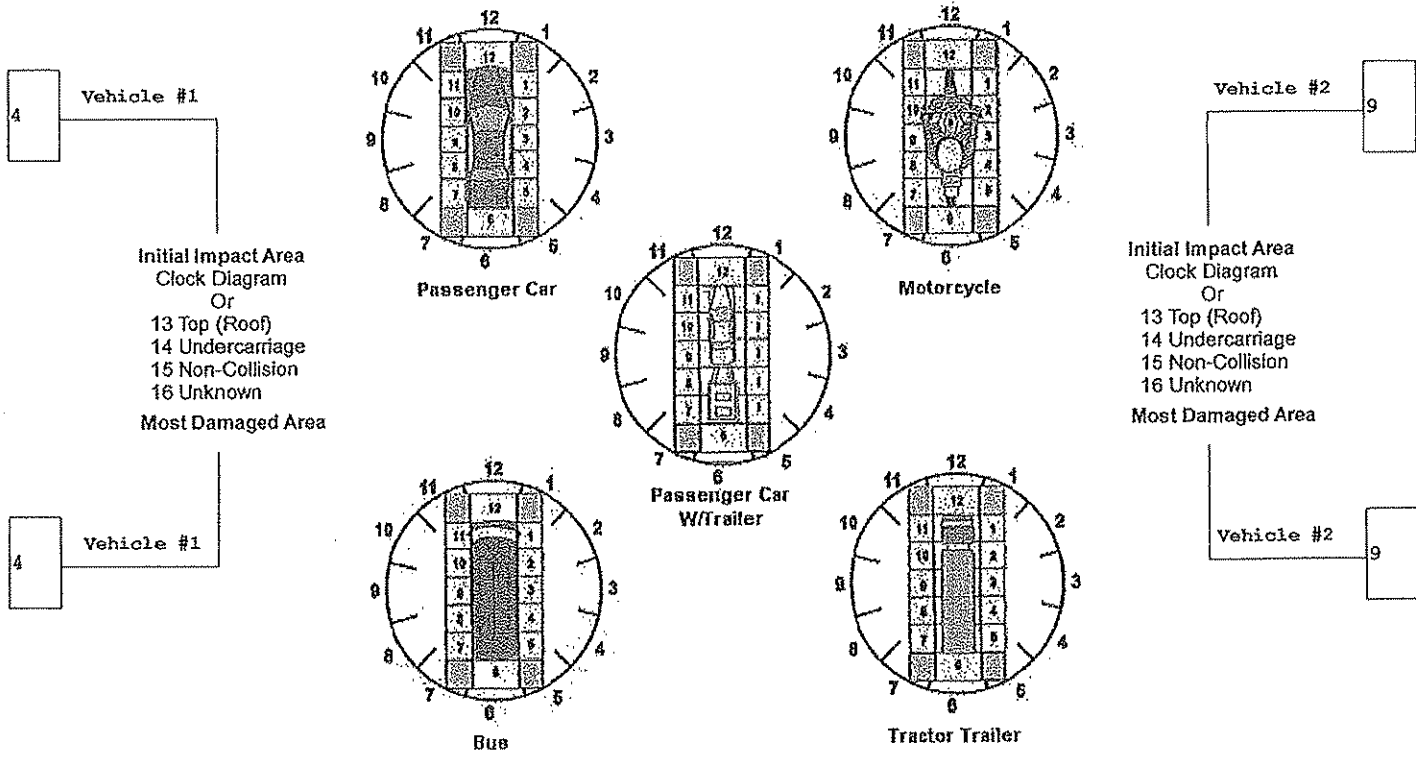

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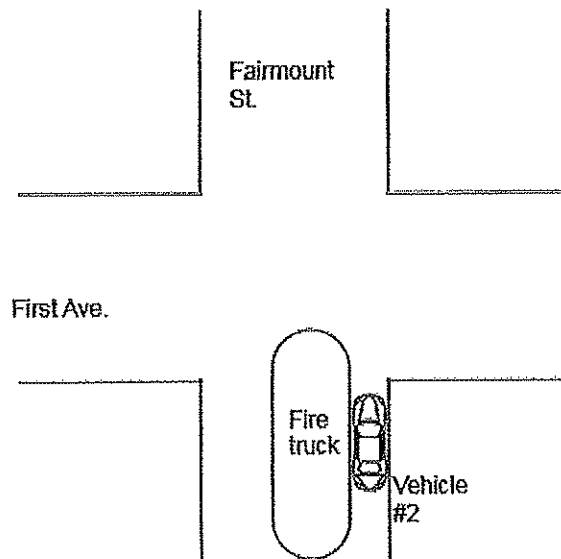

Narrative:

On 02/18/17 at approximately 1824hrs., I was dispatched to the intersection of Fairmount St., and First Ave., for a report of a motor vehicle accident involving a City Fire truck.

Upon arrival I was met by the operator of the fire truck identified as Fire Fighter Sean Newton who stated that he was travelling eastbound on Fairmount St., approaching the intersection of First Ave. Newton stated that he had to go left of center to avoid a parked vehicle and that is when another vehicle began approaching the fire truck head on. Newton stated that the vehicle did not move over and to avoid a head on collision, Newton attempted to turn the steering wheel and that is when the passenger side of the fire truck struck the parked vehicle on Fairmount St. Newton stated that he was attempting to avoid an accident since the driver of the oncoming vehicle did not yield to the fire truck which was already left of center attempting to cross the intersection. Newton stated that the fire truck did not have its emergency lights or siren activated at the time of the collision.

It should be noted that due to the size of the fire truck, the only way to pass the parked vehicle was to go left of center and then back into the lane of travel from what I observed.

The parked vehicle was unoccupied at the time of the collision and the owner, Maribel Rodriguez was contacted and responded to the scene from her residence across the street. Rodriguez was advised of the collision and provided me with valid documentation for the vehicle which was described as a silver Honda Accord (RI/PC PA-173).

It should be noted that Honda was parked legally on Fairmount St. at the time of the collision.

The Fire truck sustained damage to its passenger side rear wheel well, the exhaust as well as the rear fender and was driven from the scene.

Vehicle #2 sustained damage to the whole driver side of the vehicle and was left parked legally on Fairmount St.

At the time of the investigation into this collision, the roadway was wet, the weather was cloudy and it was night time on a lit City roadway. Nothing further to report.

Dear Chief Shatraw,

The following accident narrative relates to Incident #1416, A medical assist along with Rescue 2 at 525 Second Ave.

Rescue 2 transported patient to LMC ER with a driver from Engine 3. While in route to LMC to pick up Engine 3's Back Step, The Engine was involved in a Motor vehicle collision, while I was operating the Engine. I turned the truck from Second Ave onto Fairmount and noticed a vehicle parked off the curb on my right side. Due to the distance and limited road space I left my lane of travel attempting to navigate around the parked car. I then notice the driver proceeding in the opposite direction up Fairmount showing no sign of yielding and seemed to be heading for a head on collision with Engine 3. At that point I swerved the truck back to the lane of travel to avoid collision with the oncoming driver. When moving back to my lane I struck the Vehicle parked on my right.

At this time I brought the engine to a stop and reversed to move the truck back in the lane. Fairmount to inspect both the engine and the car I struck. Lt. Polacek contacted the Dispatch to inform them and request the Deputy and Police to our location. The Deputy Chief and Police responded along with us on scene, to properly document this accident. It was noted that the engine sustained damage to both right side fender flares and exhaust and The parked car had damage to its left side mirror and front and rear bumpers where I feel our fender flares made contact with the parked car. The Deputy chief took pictures of the apparatus and the damaged car and police collected all information for the accident report.

While inspecting the truck Lt. Polacek checked the operation of the piston valve due to its location. There was no notable damage to the valve but while operating the valve open and closed an increased effort was noted. The decision was made by the Lt and Deputy to change the valve out. We then went to station 2 and replaced with a piston valve from the crib.



Dear Chief Shatraw,

While involved in Incident #1416 which was a medical aid call at 525 Second Ave. Engine 3 was involved in a MVA. Rescue 2 had begun transport of a patient to LMC ER and took a driver from Engine 3. While Engine 3 was in route to pick up our back step man at LMC Pvt. Newton turned the truck from 2nd Ave. onto Fairmount St., traveling at about 15 to 20mph at the most, there was a car parked about 75 to 100 feet up from 1st Ave. The car was further into the travel lane than usual due to snow banked into the road way (car was @ 4 feet from the painted divided line) Pvt. Newton started around the parked car, I noticed a car approaching 1st Ave. on Fairmount while we were more than about half way past the parked car. The approaching car continued up the hill, Pvt. Newton swerved the truck to the right and side swiped the parked car, he stated he thought the approaching car was going to strike the front of the truck. Pvt. Newton stopped the truck, we backed up bit, and activated the warning lights. I contacted dispatch on ADMIN and requested the Police and Deputy to respond to our location. I inspected the truck and found damage to both fender flares, and the exhaust pipe including the exhaust system attachment. I inspected the car and found damage to the rear bumper shroud, front bumper shroud where I believe our exhaust and rear fender flare came in contact and the car mirror where I believe the front fender flare of the truck had made contact. There were also some scratches and small dents that may have also have been struck by the truck. The police and Deputy were now on scene, the Deputy received explanation and took photos and the police took information for the report and located the owner of the car who lived nearby. I also decided to check the piston intake, it did not show any obvious damage but I thought to check it due to its location. The crank was tougher than I thought it should be to turn but it did turn. I notified the Deputy and it was decided to take the valve from the spare engine. While at Station 2, I recalled that there may be a spare intake valve in the basement. I accessed the crib using a key from the key box in the Ladder 2 office, finding 2 valves (the older one did not turn) I took a new one from the shelf and notified the Deputy of such. We labeled and left the Engine 3 valve in an obvious location in the crib and I will be Emailing Capt. Cahill of such as well as an equipment repair Wufoo. The tail pipe has been pulled away from the tire (while on scene), valve placed on truck along with bleeder hose.

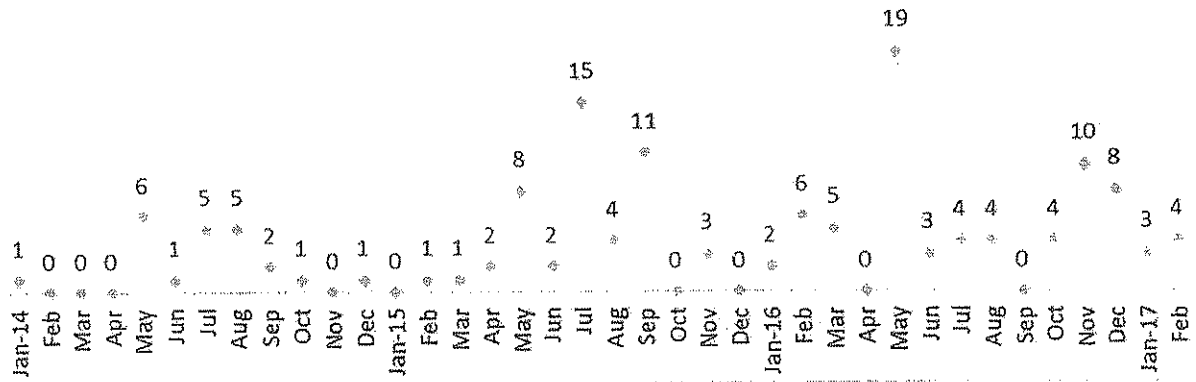

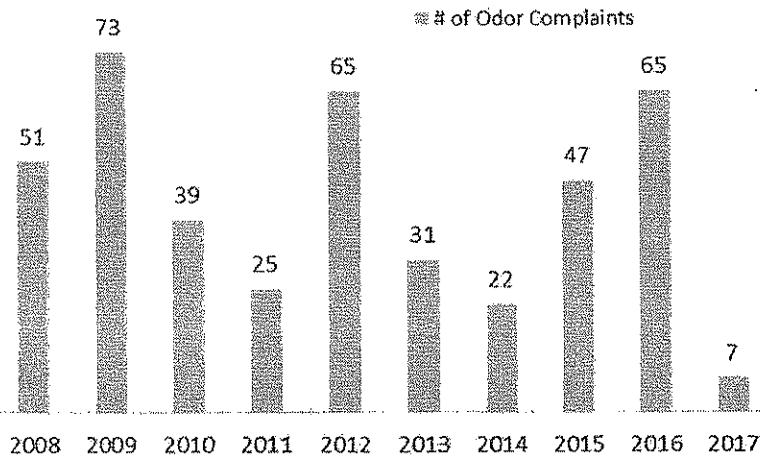

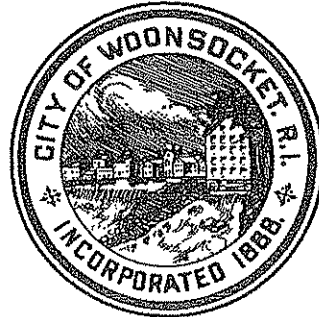

Ordinance Chapter

IN AMENDMENT OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET, RHODE ISLAND, CHAPTER 7, ENTITLED "BUILDING REGULATIONS"

WHEREAS, the City of Woonsocket, in cooperation with the State of Rhode Island, is preparing to activate an E-Permitting Building Permit System to provide for a more consumer friendly and technologically advanced method of serving property owners and service providers; and

WHEREAS, -after consultation with the Rhode Island State Building Commission, the Office of the Building Official has developed a proposed fee schedule which will maintain the level of service and the previous level of cost while meeting the obligations of the City to the State of Rhode Island with no adverse impact on City finances.

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Section 118 of the State of Rhode Island Building Code, the Code of Ordinances of the City of Woonsocket, is amended as follows;

Section 7-18. Amendments to BOCA Basic Building Code Subsection 2(c) is amended by removing the existing section in its entirety and inserting the following new section:

Fees for building, electrical, plumbing and mechanical work performed in the City of Woonsocket shall be calculated as follows:

Cost Estimate/Calculation	Applicable Fee
\$1.00 to \$10,000.00	\$16.00 per \$1,000.00
\$10,001.00 to \$50,000.00	\$160.00 plus \$14.00 per \$1,000.00
\$50,001.00 to no limit	\$720.00 plus \$12.00 per \$1,000.00

*With the implementation of E-Permitting an additional application fee of approximately three dollars (\$3.00) per application will be charged to cover costs incurred through the State that will be transmitted to the State of Rhode Island or the vendor directly. Adjustments may be made to this fee as per the contract terms.

For new construction, to include garages and additions, the City reserves the right to calculate the estimated general cost by multiplying the value specified in the current International Code Council (ICC) Building Valuation Data chart (based upon the Use and Construction Type) -times the total square footage of the structure utilizing this calculated amount as the Estimated General Cost to determine the permit fee in conjunction with the above-referenced table.

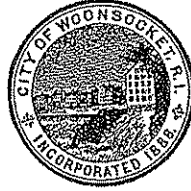
Section 118.0 (c)(2) *Failed Inspection fee*; Section 118.0(c)(3) *Late filing fee*; Section 118.0(c)(4) *Rebate of Payment*, to remain the same.

ADD: New section 18.0(c)(5) *Utility Service Reconnection Inspection*. Upon notification from the utility company, to include but not limited to National Grid electrical and gas services, mandating inspection approval from the Building Official Division to reinstate service, shall be subject to a fifty dollar (\$50.00) inspection fee to be paid by the property owner. Said fee is only applicable in the event that an Electrical, Plumbing or Mechanical permit has not been issued for work performed on the respective service.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately following its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

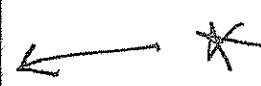

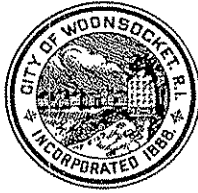
