Please accept this letter as a supplement to my veto notice of 17 O12.

17 O 12 attempts to defund the salary of a crucial member of city government, Blake Collins, who is the City's Business Outreach and Public Relations Coordinator.

Passage of this ordinance is a shortsighted decision to strip the City's administration of a full-time employee that is tasked with economic development and communications efforts. Eliminating this position adversely affects the City's efforts to communicate with the business community and general public. Moreover, the elimination of this position will undoubtedly undermine the city's efforts in attracting new businesses and accommodating existing businesses in the City of Woonsocket. Blake has developed into an integral part of the team here at City Hall, and functions as a key resource for all of our Departments and Directors.

In addition to the organizational strain this ordinance places upon the administration of this City, the optics of eliminating an economic development position is one that needs to be avoided by a City on the precipice of future economic success. 17 O 12 hobbles City Hall and ultimately the residents and businesses that currently and in the future interact with Blake.

This claim for property damage arises out of an alleged incident that occurred on or about April 5, 2017. Ms. Sanabria claims she damaged a tire of her 2015 Toyota after striking a pothole on East School Street close to World War II Veterans Memorial Park.

Ms. Sanabria submitted a receipt from Bristol Toyota Scion, Inc. in the amount of \$177.34 for the replacement of the tire. She supplied a police report noting the damage to the tire and that a pot hole on East School Street had been reported, but not the date the reporting was received. She also submitted a picture of a damaged tire and a pothole. Our Highway Department was contacted and there was no record of any pothole complaint at that location as far back as March 2, 2017.

The amount of his claim is noted as \$177.34. Using the receipt and accounting for replacement of only two tires, his claim would be in the amount of \$226.68. Under R.I.G.L. § 24-5-13 (b), a person may collect up to \$300.00 for damage caused by a pothole. There were no site reports prior to the date of the incident to the City. As there was no prior notice, the City is within its rights to deny the claim. I recommend that this claim be denied.




