Dear Councilors:

This claim for property damage arises out of an alleged incident that occurred on June 1, 2071. Ms. Burrows reported to the City that she sustained damage to 2008 Chevrolet Cobalt after turning onto East School Street from North Main Street. She said her vehicle struck a pot hole there.

Ms. Burrows submitted receipts from Tasca Chevrolet for replacement of the left front control arm totaling \$456.23. She also submitted a police report noting that the following day there were many patched holes noted in the area, but no open holes. A report from the Highway Department noted that no complaints had been received, however many holes had been filled in that area.

Under R.I.G.L. § 24-5-13 (b), a person may collect up to \$300 for damage caused by a pothole. Her claim totals \$456.23. There were no site-specific reports prior to the date of the incident to the City; however the Highway Department had observed areas of need in that location. Since there was no prior notice, the City is within its rights to deny the claim. However, I recommend that \$300.00 be paid, given the observed condition of the roadway.

Upon arrival I observed Cruiser 303 and a black Mercedes Benz in the parking lot of the Quick Mart. I spoke with Lt. Doura who was operating Cruiser 303 who stated that he was stopped in traffic in front of the quick mart responding to a separate motor vehicle accident with unknown injuries. He stated that he activated his emergency lights and travelled past several vehicles when he heard a crash and noticed that the rear passenger side of his cruiser came into collision with vehicle #2's driver's side front bumper and fender. I then spoke with the operator of vehicle #2 identified as Carol Chattman who stated that she was stopped in traffic when the police cruiser's passenger side came into collision with her vehicle's front bumper as it was attempting to re enter the lane of travel. There were no injuries at the time of the collision. Vehicle #1 sustained damage to it's rear passenger door. Vehicle #2 sustained damage to it's front driver's side bumper. At the time of the investigation into this collision it was nighttime on a well lit road, the weather was clear and the roadway was dry. (2) At 1747 hrs. on Saturday, 19NOV16, I was dispatched to Diamond Hill Rd. and St. Leon Ave. to assist with a motor vehicle crash with unknown injuries. I was traveling west on Diamond Hill Rd. and as I approached the intersection with St. Cecile Ave., traffic was stopped in front of me. I activated my emergency lights and moved into the opposite lane of travel to pass the stopped traffic. As I continued straight, I heard a crash and felt a collision on my passenger side. I stopped, exited my vehicle and observed a vehicle later identified as RI (PC) LW625 displayed on a 2001 Mercedes Benz, color black pulling into the parking lot to my right. I then notified dispatch, returned to my cruiser and moved my vehicle into the parking lot as well. I met with the operator who identified herself as Carol Chattman. I asked her what happened and she told me that she did not know. I observed what appeared to be minor damage to the front drivers side of her vehicle surrounding the headlamp assembly. There was old damage with rust in the same area. Inspecting my cruiser, it appears there is new damage to the passenger side rear door and wheel well. I was not injured and when Sgt. Ronald Marcos and Plim. Corey Johnson arrived on scene, they initiated their investigation of the crash.
















AUTHORIZING SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH RHODE ISLAND RESOURCE RECOVERY CORPORATION

- WHEREAS, the City Solid Waste and Recycling Services Agreement with the Rhode Island Resource Recovery Corporation will expire on June 30, 2017; and
- WHEREAS, the contract has been reviewed by the Superintendent of Solid Waste, the Director of Public Works and the City Solicitor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET, RHODE ISLAND, AS FOLLOWS:

- SECTION 1. The Mayor of the City of Woonsocket is hereby authorized to sign into contract with Rhode Island Resource Recovery Corporation from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2019 for solid waste and recycling services.
- SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 10, of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

AMENDING CHAPTER 13 ENTITLED, "LICENSES AND PERMITS" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF WOONSOCKET

WHEREAS, Cigarette smoking is dangerous to human health. Scientific evidence exists that the use of tobacco products causes cancer, heart disease and other medical disorders; and

WHEREAS, The Surgeon General of the United States of America has declared that nicotine addiction from tobacco is the most widespread example of drug addiction in this country. The National Institute of Drug Abuse concluded that the majority of the 320,000 Americans who die each year from cigarette smoking became addicted to nicotine as adolescents; and

WHEREAS,
The Rhode Island General Assembly declared that the use of tobacco by Rhode Island children is a health and substance abuse problem of the utmost severity. State Tobacco retailers illegally sell over 900,000 packs of tobacco products to children annually, which equals 2,500 packs a day. According the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the smoking-related direct medical cost in the state has climbed to over \$186,000,000.00.
This a health and economic drain created by each new generation of children who begin using tobacco products and become addicted to nicotine; and

WHEREAS, The City Council has the responsibility and authority to regulate, conduct and legislate on matters of local concern affecting public health, safety and welfare. Sitting as the board of license commissioners, the Council has the authority to issue, suspend or revoke tobacco licenses when violations are presented to them.

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET, RHODE ISLAND AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Section 13-3 entitled, "Fee Schedule" of Chapter 13, entitled, "Licenses and Permits" of the Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket is hereby amended by adding the following section as follows:

Class: Tobacco Product License

Term: 1 year

SECTION 3.

Date due or issued: July 1st Fee: \$75.00-\$250.00

SECTION 2. That Section 13-13 entitled, "Tobacco Product Licenses" of Chapter 13, entitled, "Licenses and Permits" of the Code of Ordinances, City of Woonsocket is hereby amended by adding the following section as follows:

Board of licenses means the Woonsocket City Council sitting as the Board of License Commissioners.

Characterizing flavor means a distinguishable taste or aroma, other than the taste or aroma of tobacco, menthol, mint or winter green imparted either prior to or during consumption of a tobacco product or component part thereof, including, but not limited to, tastes or aromas relating to any fruit, chocolate, vanilla, honey, candy, cocoa, dessert, alcoholic beverage, herb, or spice; provided, however, that no tobacco product shall be determined to have characterizing flavor solely because of the use of additives or flavorings or the provision of ingredient information.

Cigar means any roll of tobacco other than Cigarette wrapped entirely or in part in tobacco or any substance containing tobacco and weighing more than four pounds per thousand.

Cigarette means: (1) any roll of tobacco wrapped in paper or in any substance not containing tobacco, and (2) any roll of tobacco wrapped in any substance containing tobacco which, because of its appearance, the type of tobacco used in the filler, or its packaging and labeling, is likely to be offered to, or purchased by, consumers as a cigarette described in clause (1) of this definition.

Component part means any element of a tobacco product, including, but not limited to, the tobacco, filter, and paper, but not including any constituent.

Constituent means any ingredient, substance, chemical, or compound, other than tobacco, water, or reconstituted tobacco sheet, which is added by the manufacturer to a tobacco product during the processing, manufacture or packing of the tobacco product. Such term shall include a smoke constituent.

Consumer means a person who purchases a tobacco product for consumption and not for sale to another.

Coupon means any voucher, rebate, card, paper, note, form statement, ticket, image, or other issue; whether in paper, digital, or other form; used for commercial purposes to obtain an article, product, service, or accommodation without charge or at a discounted price.

Distinguishable means perceivable by an ordinary consumer by either the sense of smell or taste.

Flavored tobacco product means any tobacco product, other than a cigarette, that contains a constituent that imparts a characterizing flavor.

Full retail price means the higher of the price listed for a tobacco product on its packaging or the price listed on any related shelving, posting, advertising, or display where the tobacco product is sold or offered for sale, plus all applicable taxes and fees if such taxes and fees are not included in the listed price, and before the application of any discounts or coupons.

Little cigar means any roll of tobacco other than a Cigarette wrapped entirely or in part in tobacco or any substance containing tobacco and weighing no more than four pounds per thousand. "Little Cigar" includes, but is not limited to, tobacco products known or labeled as "small cigar" or "little cigar."

Non-cigarette tobacco product means a tobacco product that is not a cigarette.

Package or packaging means a pack, box, carton, or container of any kind or, if no other container, any wrapping (including cellophane) in which a tobacco product is sold or offered for sale to a consumer.

Person means any natural person, partnership, firm, joint stock company, corporation, or employee thereof, or other legal entity.

Sale or sell means any transfer, exchange, barter, gift, offer for sale, or distribution for a commercial purpose, in any manner or by any means whatsoever.

Smoke constituent means any chemical or chemical compound in mainstream or sidestream tobacco product smoke that either transfers from any component of the tobacco product to the smoke or that is formed by the combustion or hearing of tobacco, additives, or other component of the tobacco product.

Tobacco product means: (1) any product containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption, whether smoke, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, and snuff; and (2) any electronic device that delivers nicotine or other substances to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electronic cigarette, cigar, pipe, or hookah. Notwithstanding any provision of clauses (1) and (2) in this definition to the contrary, tobacco product includes any component, part, or accessory of a tobacco product, whether or not sold separately; tobacco product does not include any product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco cessation product or for other therapeutic purposes whether such product is marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.

Vending machine means any mechanical, electrical, or electronic self-service device which, upon insertion of money, tokens, or any other form of payment, dispenses tobacco products.

SECTION 4. License Required.

It shall be unlawful to sell or to possess with the intention of selling tobacco products within the City without having first obtained a tobacco dealer's license pursuant to this article. Such license shall be in addition to any other license required by state and/or federal law. A tobacco dealer's license is valid for one person at one location and may not be transferred from one person to another or from one location to another. Failure to obtain and maintain a valid license shall result in a fine of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation. The fee for the tobacco dealer's license shall be Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) Two-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per year. All licenses granted under the provisions of this article shall be displayed in a conspicuous place within the business so licensed.

SECTION 5. License Eligibility.

Licenses shall only be granted to authorize the sale of tobacco products within the City at a fixed location. For example, the sale of tobacco products by persons on foot or from vehicles is prohibited.

SECTION 6. License application; term.

Application for a license shall be submitted to the board of licensees together with an application fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) Two-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). A tobacco dealer's license shall be effective through the thirty-first (31st) day of December of the calendar year for which it is issued. No license shall be granted without proof that the applicant has obtained all necessary state licenses for the sale of tobacco products.

SECTION 7. Requirements and prohibitions restrictions applicable to licensees.

- (a) No licensee, or employee or agent of such licensee, shall sell or possess with the intention of selling a tobacco product to another person who appears to be under the age of twenty-seven (27) years without first examining the identification of the recipient to confirm that the recipient is at least the minimum age under state law to purchase and possess the tobacco product.
- (b) Display of price. The price of each tobacco product offered for sale shall be clearly and conspicuously displayed to clearly indicate the price of the product.
- (c) Packaging and labeling. No licensee, or employee or agent of such licensee, shall sell any tobacco product unless such product: (1) is sold in the original manufacturer's packaging intended for sale to consumers; and (2) conforms to all applicable federal labeling requirements.
- (d) Prohibition of tobacco coupons and discounts. No licensee, or employee or agent of such licensee, shall:

1. Accept or redcem, or offer to accept or redcem, or cause or hire any
person to accept or redeem or offer to accept or redeem any coupon that provides any
tobacco product to a consumer without charge or for less than the full retail price;

2. Sell any tobacco product to a consumer through a multiple package discount (e.g. "buy two get one free") or otherwise provide any tobacco product to a

consumer for less than the full retail price in exchange for the purchase of any other tobacco product;

3. Provide any free or discounted item to a consumer in exchange for the purchase of any tobacco-product.

(e)(d) Sale of flavored tobacco products prohibited-restricted. No licensee, or employee or agent of such licensee, shall sell or possess with the intention of selling any flavored tobacco product to a consumer person under eighteen (18) years of age. A non-eigarette tobacco product is presumed to be a flavored tobacco product if a manufacturer or any of the manufacturer's agents or employees has: (1) made a public statement or claim that the non-cigarette tobacco product has or produces a characterizing flavor, including, but not limited to, text and/or images on the product's labeling or packaging that are used to explicitly or implicitly communicate information about the flavor, taste, or aroma of a non-cigarette tobacco product; or (2) taken action directed to consumers that would be reasonably expected to result in consumers believing that the non-cigarette tobacco product imparts a characterizing flavor. Each licensee shall maintain on the premises the original labeling and packaging provided by the manufacturer for all tobacco products that are sold or offered for sale by the licensee separately from the original packaging designed for retail sale to the consumer. The original labeling and packaging from which the contents are sold separately shall be maintained during such time as the contents of the package are offered for sale, and may be disposed of upon the sale of the entire contents of such package. Any flavored tobacco products must be maintained for sale behind the sales counter in an area that is not accessible to the general public and cannot be obtained without the assistance from the licensee, employee or agent of licensee.

This subsection $(e)(\underline{d})$ shall not apply to the following businesses:

- 1. A smoking bar as defined in Section 23-20.10-2(15) of the Rhode Island General Laws.
- 2. A retail store as defined in Section 23-20.10-2(11) of the Rhode Island General Laws.
 - 3. An electronic smoking device establishment.

SECTION 8. Suspension or revocation of license - fines and costs.

The Woonsocket Police Department shall enforce the provisions of this article. All licensees shall be subject to a compliance check at least two (2) times a year; violators shall be checked more frequently until two (2) consecutive compliance checks are completed without violation. If an alleged violation occurs, the Woonsocket Police Department shall issue a citation that will require the licensee to appear for a show cause hearing before the board of licenses. If, after a hearing, the board finds that a violation has occurred, the board shall impose a civil fine of Two Hundred-Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for the first offense; Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the second offense; and Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the first offense, and additionally may impose suspension or revocation of license; One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the second offense and additionally may impose suspension or revocation of license; and One Thousand Two-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) for any subsequent offense(s) and additionally may impose suspension or revocation of license. Additionally, the board may suspend or revoke the license. If a licensee maintains its license for Thirty-Six (36) consecutive months without a violation, any new violation shall be treated as a first offense. It is the intent of this legislation that all fines collected by the City hereunder shall be deposited into a Restricted Receipt Account used by the board of licensees and to be utilized by the Woonsocket Police Department for the purpose of conducting tobacco product compliance checks and for enforcement of this ordinance.

SECTION 9. Use of premises during license suspension.

During the period of any suspension of a tobacco dealer's license, the licensee shall remove all tobacco products from the retail display area of the location and secure them in a locked area for the duration of the suspension. If, at any time during the suspension period, the licensee is found to be selling, distributing, or delivering any tobacco products, the license shall be revoked.

SECTION 10. Vending machines.

Businesses which have vending machines shall be subject to the same fines and penalties as described in Section 6 of this article. In the event that a tobacco dealer's license is suspended or revoked, then the vending machine shall be removed from the licensed location for the period of suspension or revocation.

SECTION 11. Severability.

If any provision of this article or application thereof to any person or circumstances, is held unconstitutional, illegal, or otherwise invalid, the remaining provisions of this article and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances, other than those to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 12.

This Ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2017 following its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

DIRECTING THE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF A TAX BY
THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET UPON REAL ESTATE, EXCISE
AND TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR
FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2017 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2018

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

The City Council of the City of Woonsocket hereby orders the assessment and collection of taxes on the ratable real estate, excise and tangible personal property the sum not less than \$62,355,475 and not more than \$63,602,585. Said tax is for the payment of the appropriation made by the City Council including the ordinary expenses of the City, the payment of interest and indebtedness, including sinking funds and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on inhabitants and ratable property of said property of said city as of the 31st day of December, 2016, at twelve o'clock midnight, according to law.

And the City Assessor shall date, certify, deliver to and deposit the same in the office of the City Clerk on or before the 1st day of July A.D., 2017 and the several taxes therein shall be due and payable to the City Treasurer on or before the 15th day of July, 2017 or may be paid in accordance with Sections 7 and 8, Chapter 5, Title 44 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended. Unpaid taxes shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of fifteen (15%) percent per annum from the date of July 15, 2017.

Said tax may be paid in quarterly installments, for the first installment of twenty five (25%) percent on or before the 15th day of July, 2017, the second installment of twenty five (25%) percent on or before the 15th day of October, 2017, the third quarter installment of twenty five (25%) percent on or before the 15th day of January, 2018 and the fourth installment of twenty five (25%) percent on or before the 15th day of April, 2018. Each quarterly installment must include a minimum payment of 25% for real estate, 25% for excise and 25% for tangible personal property.

Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order shall be free from any charges for interest; provided, however, the option to pay taxes in quarterly installments shall not apply to any tax account levied in an amount not in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Once delinquent, any taxpayer who has failed to remit any quarterly payment by the required due date may, upon paying all taxes due plus interest owed, be reinstated to a current non-delinquent status and continue to have the option to make payments on a quarterly basis.

Pursuant to R.I.G.L. § 44-5-75 and R.I.G.L. § 44-5-74.1, the City of Woonsocket has adopted a system of property tax classification and has fixed the amount of an owner-occupied homestead exemption from local taxation on eligible real property used for residential purposes and which is owner occupied. Section 2-14, as amended, of the Code of Ordinances, entitled "Tax Classification/Homestead Exemption Procedure" is hereby adopted and incorporated in this Ordinance.

In keeping with the authorization as provided in R.I.G.L § 44-3, Section 2-11 of the Woonsocket Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

The amount of the following exemptions with respect to the credit from local taxation on taxable property is fixed as follows:

- (a) Veterans as defined in Section 44-3-4 of the General Laws of Rhode Island and the un-remarried widow or widower off such veterans at a credit of one hundred and fifty eight dollars and seventy six cents (\$158.76).
- (b) Blind persons as defined in Section 44-3-12 of the General Laws of Rhode Island at a credit of four hundred and seventy six dollars and twenty eight cents (\$476.28).
- (c) Veterans who are totally disabled as defined in Section 44-3-4, of the General Laws of Rhode Island at three hundred and ninety six dollars and ninety cents (\$396.90).
- (d) Gold Star Parents as defined in Section 44-3-5 of the General Laws of Rhode Island at two hundred and thirty eight dollars and fourteen cents (\$238.14).
- (e) Elderly as defined in Chapter 2, Article I, Section 2-11 entitled "Tax exemption for the elderly" of the Code of Ordinances is at four hundred and thirty eight dollars and ninety six cents (\$438.96).

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on the eleventh consecutive day following its passage by the City Council, as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, the Woonsocket City Council approved the Department of Planning and Development's proposed changes to the Zoning Ordinance in August of 2016;

and

WHEREAS, the Department of Planning and Development staff has recommended some additional changes to Section 5.3 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Woonsocket; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of that change provided for more clarification and public understanding of the zoning requirements; and

WHEREAS, it was found that more clarification was necessary in Section 5.3.

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOONSOCKET AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Entitled "Zoning" is hereby amended as follows:

Amend Section 5.3 of the Zoning Ordinance as follows:

5.3 Restrictions on Storage of Vehicles.

Pursuant to a signed, written complaint on behalf of an identifiable complainant, and in compliance with State Law pursuant to access to private property, the zoning officer, the public works director, chief of police, or their designee shall have the authority to order removed any vehicle located on private property which presents a hazard to children or other persons, or harbors tall grass or weeds, or creates a fire hazard, or affords a breeding place or nesting place for mosquitoes, flies, rodents or other vermin. Any such order shall be communicated in writing with an explanation of the reason for removal order.

5.3-1 Except as provided for in other regulations n No more than one operative unregistered vehicle and no or no more than one inoperative, disabled, or inserviceable or dismantled vehicle, whether registered or unregistered, shall be parked, kept or stored in any residential district, provided however there shall be no more than one vehicle in total allowable pursuant to this section and no vehicle shall at any time be wrecked in whole or in part, in a state of major

disassembly, <u>major</u> disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled, <u>and/or covered with debris, rust, weeds or other growth</u>, in such residential district. Painting of vehicles is prohibited unless conducted inside an approved spray-booth.

For the purposes of this section, the phrase "inoperable vehicle" means a vehicle which has not been moved or driven from its current location because of its condition for a period of more than 90 days and cannot be driven on any public streets for being unregistered, unlicensed or mechanically impaired. It does not include a vehicle wrecked in whole or in part, in a state of deterioration and/or covered with debris, rust, weeds or other growth—any vehicle which cannot be driven upon the public streets for any reason including, but not limited to, being unregistered, unlicensed, wrecked in whole or in part, abandoned, in a state of disrepair or deteriorated and/or covered with debris, rust, weeds or other growth, or incapable of being moved under its own power or which has not been moved or driven from its current location because of its condition for a period of more than 30 days.

Exception: A vehicle of any kind <u>owned by the homeowner or tenant</u> is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including body work, provided such work is performed inside a structure or similar enclosed area designed and approved for such purposes.

SECTION 2.

This Ordinance shall be enacted in accordance with the provisions of Sections 45-24-27 and 45-24-72 of the Rhode Island General Laws, and amended, and shall take effect immediately following its passage by the City Council as provided in Chapter III, Section 9 of the Woonsocket Home Rule Charter and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith or hereby repealed.

Expansion of Parking Lot Usage Request Narrative

P&EE Consulting Inc. dba FoodTrucksIn.com has partnered with NeighborWorks Kitchen to bring Market Square Food Truck Nights to Market Square in Woonsocket. Previously on March resolution 17 R 28 grant permission of 5 spots directly in front of Neighborworks to be used for the event. At this time due to the initial success of the event and support from the community we are asking for an expansion to including the additional 4 parking spots directly in front of the Museum of Work and Culture. The addition of these spaces will allow for the growing crowd to have more space to enjoy the evening while preventing overcrowding.

As per the application we are also asking to extend the access of the spaces in the municipal spots to include the first Friday of the month in September and October with the hopes of continued success of the event.

I have included the support we have received from the museum below along with the layout of the space requested, and finally some examples of the support we are receiving from the community.
